

He also serves as the Chief of Surgical Oncology and Vice-Chair for Academic Affairs in the Department of Surgery at the University of Nebraska. Dr. Mammen's clinical practice focuses on patients with advanced cutaneous malignancies (including melanoma and Merkel cell cancer) and soft tissue sarcomas. Dr. Mammen's clinical and translational research focuses on melanoma, soft tissue sarcomas, breast cancer, and pancreatic cancer. He is an experienced clinical trialist and serves as the national primary investigator of a melanoma clinical trial (SWOG 2015) and the national co-primary investigator of a breast cancer clinical trial that recently completed enrollment (SWOG 1418).

Dr. Mammen has served in leadership positions in numerous surgical organizations. He is currently the Chair of the American College of Surgeons Political Action Committee (SurgeonsPAC). He recently completed his term on the American Board of Surgery where he was Councilor, Chair of the Education and Training Committee, and Chair of the Complex General Surgical Oncology Continuous Certification Assessment Committee. Dr. Mammen has served in the past as the President of the Kansas Chapter of the American College of Surgeons, the Kansas City Medical Association, and the Kansas City Surgical Society. THE DR. ANDRE CROTTI LECTURE



The US Section has selected Dr. George Ferzli to receive the Dr. Andre Crotti Award for Distinguished Service to the Profession of Surgery. Ferzli, embodies the professional excellence and achievements of Dr. Crotti, who served as the first president of the US Section.

Dr. George S. Ferzli, MD, FACS, is a Clinical Professor of Surgery at NYU Grossman School of Medicine, and is also Director of the Advanced GI, MIS and Bariatrics Fellowship Program at NYU Langone. Since 1995, this distinguished program has graduated 36 laparoscopic fellows under his guidance. Moreover, Dr. Ferzli serves as the Medical Director of the MBSAQIP at NYU Langone Health in Brooklyn, showcasing his commitment to advancing surgical excellence.

Dr. Ferzli earned his Medical Degree from St. Joseph University School of Medicine in Beirut, Lebanon and completed his general surgery residency at Zucker School of Medicine at Hofstra/Northwell at Staten Island University Hospital. He holds Diplomate status with both the American Board of Surgery

and the American Board of Surgical Critical Care.

With over 44 years of experience in the medical field, Dr. Ferzli also previously held the positions of Chairman of Surgery at Lutheran Medical Center (now NYU Langone), Professor of Surgery at SUNY Downstate Health Science Center, and Chief MIS fellowship at SUNY Downstate and Staten Island University Hospital, among other leadership positions in the medical community.

Inspired by his father's dedication to the education of surgery, Dr. Ferzli has made a profound impact on the global medical field. His expertise has been shared through lectures and surgeries conducted in over 30 countries and 60 cities worldwide across hospitals, universities, and medical schools.

Dr. Ferzli is renowned as a pioneer in laparoscopic techniques, having been among the first surgeons globally to perform laparoscopic minimally invasive procedures. With 12 U.S. government patents for laparoscopic surgical instruments to his name, along with over 150 peer-reviewed articles and 30 surgical textbook chapters, his contributions to medical innovation are undeniable.

THE AMERICAN COLLEGE OF SURGEONS PRESIDENT'S LECTURE

BETH SUTTON, MD, FACS, PRESIDENT, AMERICAN COLLEGE OF SURGEONS, is the 105th president of the ACS, is a general surgeon from Wichita Falls, TX, who has spent her career in private practice.

Dr. Sutton earned her medical doctorate from Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, Texas. After a surgery internship at St. Paul Hospital in Dallas, she completed a residency in general surgery at Scott and White Memorial Hospital, in Temple, Texas, from which she has since received a Distinguished Alumna in General Surgery Award.

A Fellow of the College since 1984, she has been active in her involvement at the ACS. She is a Past President of the North Texas ACS Chapter and past Governor-at-Large representing North Texas. She is a past member of more than a dozen ACS committees, including the Committee on Healthcare Disparities, Committee on Professional Opportunities for Senior Surgeons, Advisory Council for General Surgery, Committee on Transition to Practice (Mastery in General Surgery), and committee on Preceptorship for Practicing Surgeons. In addition, she has served as faculty for the Surgeons as Leaders Course since 2013. Her ACS leadership also includes almost a decade on the Board of Regents, including a year as Chair (2019-2020).

At the ACS and beyond, her work has included a focus on optimizing access and reducing health disparities. She is a current member of the ACS Committee on Optimal Access/Healthcare Disparities, and through that committee

was a participant in the National Institutes of Health-ACS Symposium on Surgical Disparities Research in 2015, which resulted in the publication "Setting a National Agenda for Surgical Disparities Research: Recommendations from the National Institutes of Health and American College of Surgeons Summit," published in JAMA Surgery.

She has also worked to advance women in surgery. In addition to serving on the ACS Women in Surgery Committee, she is a past president of the Association of Women Surgeons and a past member of the Association of Women Surgeons Foundation Board of Trustees. She has been a recipient of the Association of Women Surgeons Foundation's Nina Starr Braunwald Award for contributions to the advancement of women in surgery.

She is a current Director of the American Board of Surgery, as well as a past Secretary and past President of the Texas Surgical Society, a past local president of the American Cancer Society, and a member of several other surgical societies and associations. She has been a recipient of the United Regional Healthcare System Department of Surgery Quality Champion Award.

Asked about her vision for her ACS presidency, Dr. Sutton has said, "Our Fellows include surgeons from all surgical specialties. My hope is to facilitate camaraderie and interaction between our specialties, so that we can increasingly excel together to care for our patients."

THE DR. ARNO A. ROSCHER ENDOWED LECTURE



Dr. Maurice Wright will present the Dr. Arno A. Roscher Endowed Lecture. Dr. Maurice Wright is the Chief Medical Officer for New York City Health and Hospital I Harlem and Senior Associate Dean of Columbia University Medical Center for the Academic Affiliation at Harlem Hospital Center since September 2010. Formally,

he held the position of Chief of Emergency Services at Woodhull Medicine Center for fourteen years. Prior to his term at Woodhull, he spent ten years at St. Luke's, Roosevelt Hospital Center, where he completed his residency and later became a faculty member and Assistant Director for the Department of Emergency Medicine.

As CMO, he is the principal medical advisor to the CEO of New York City Health and Hospitals I Harlem. He ensures that clinical and educational programs of all departments are consistent with the priorities and standards of the New York City Health and Hospitals. As Senior Associate Dean for the CUMC Academic Affiliation, Dr. Wright is responsible for oversight to the faculty appointment and promotion processes. All academic responsibilities for Columbia University students and the ACGME- regulated post-graduate training programs at Harlem Hospital Center fall under his leadership.

As Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Wright's focused on redesigning the medical and surgical services to enhance quality, efficiency in the delivery of care and expansion in scope of services. The Perioperative redesign involved moving into new ambulatory surgery area, OR's, endoscopy, bronchoscopy and PACU suites. He oversaw the accreditation of the trauma system now an ACS level 2 designation and developed a surgical

robotic service. This redesign has positioned NYC Health+ Hospitals I Harlem for excellent medical and surgical services in the community.

Dr. Wright is a visionary leader who fosters team work and inspires excellence. While managing a highvolume ED, he was able to achieve a high standard of quality care that was both responsive to community needs and sensitive to community concerns. Among his accomplishments, as ED chief he embarked on a clinical upgrade and re-design a public hospital Emergency Department; implemented evidence- base practice guidelines and used a vigorous performance improvement program to improve care successfully. This was strategic and led to his appointment as Chief Medical Officer.

Dr. Wright is a graduate of Fordham University and Albert Einstein College of Medicine. He holds several academic appointments, including Assistant Clinical Professor of Medicine at Columbia University and Adjunct Medical Clinical Professor of the CUNY Medical School Physician's Assistant Program. He is a member of several professional organizations, including the American College of Emergency Physicians, the American College of Physicians and the National Association of Public Hospitals and Health Systems. He graduated from the Physician Leadership Institute in June of 2003. Dr. Wright is also a graduate of the Patient Safety Officer training program at The Institute for Health Care Improvement and is a past member of NYC Health and Hospitals Patient Safety Committee. Dr. McKenney's career includes serving as the Medical Department Head, USS Coronado, Middle East Force, Chief of Surgery and Chief of Medical Staff, US Naval Hospital, Naples Italy, Chief of Medical Staff at Biloxi Regional Medical Center with extensive experience in general, vascular and thoracic surgery in private practice. A committed servant of Christ, he founded

Hospital Loma de Luz in Balfate, Honduras, where he has served as Chief Surgeon and Director since 2000, providing vital healthcare services to underserved communities. He is also the founder of the Asociación Piedra Angular de Honduras and of The Cornerstone Foundation (USA), which supports Loma de Luz and various disaster relief efforts, including post-Hurricane Mitch and Hurricane Katrina recovery.

Dr. McKenney is currently board-certified by the American Board of Surgery, a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons and of the International College of Surgeons, as well as a member of the Colegio Medico de Honduras. He is a member of MENSA and of the International Society for Philosophical Enquiry and has earned numerous military honors during his time with the U.S. Navy Medical Corps. Throughout his career, Dr. McKenney has provided healthcare to the most impoverished communities in numerous developing nations as a form of service to Christ.


